



Professor Troege teaches finance at ESCP Business School, where he is in charge of the Investment Banking Specialisation on the Paris campus and teaches courses in Advanced Corporate Finance and Financial Institutions Management. In addition, he contributes to a range of Executive Education programmes.

His research focuses on game theory and commercial banking, with particular emphasis on the competitive interactions among banks in credit markets. In this context, he has served as an expert for the European Commission, participating in the Sector Inquiry into Retail Banking as well as in the Study on the Impact of State Aid Rules for Banks in Difficulty.

His work has been published in a variety of academic and practitioner-oriented journals, including the *Review of Financial Studies*, *Games and Economic Behavior*, *Journal of Corporate Finance*, *International Journal of Industrial Organization*, and the *EC Competition Policy Newsletter*. Professor Troege is also a regular contributor to the business press and has published op-eds in leading newspapers such as the *Financial Times*, *The Wall Street Journal*, and *Le Monde*. In addition to his academic research, he has served as a consultant specialising in the intersection of antitrust and finance.

Professor Troege holds a master's degree in Mathematics from Ludwig Maximilians Universität München and a DESS in Finance from the Institut d'Études Politiques de Paris. He subsequently earned a PhD in Financial Economics from Humboldt Universität Berlin and a Habilitation from Université Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne. Prior to joining ESCP Business School, he was a research associate at the Wissenschaftszentrum Berlin (WZB), a government-sponsored think tank, and a visiting scholar at the J. L. Kellogg Graduate School of Management at Northwestern University.
