

## Procurement Procedure for an IT Infrastructure Service Supplier Ref. EBA/2012/021/OPS/IT/RT

No.	Document Reference	Question	EBA Response
1.	PQQ/ Contract Notice	Does the EBA know what their power requirements are for the Data Centre (per DC), if so can you share this information for sizing purposes and ensures our DCs will fulfil the requirements?	EBA is intending to procure IT infrastructure as a service. Therefore, it will be the responsibility of the supplier to assess and provide Data Centre power and Data Centre space. EBA will specify capacity requirements on a higher infrastructure level, i.e. based on number of servers, storage and network bandwidth.  The technical specifications will be distributed after conclusion of the PQQ stage.
2.	PQQ/ Contract Notice	Would it be possible to receive a copy of the EBA's terms and conditions?	EBA's terms and conditions of contract will be provided at the next stage i.e. to the applicants invited to submit a tender.
3.	PQQ/ Contract Notice	If we submit the pre-qualification as a consortium will we be required to present a Power of Attorney?	If a candidate submits a PQQ as a consortium it is recommended to submit a Power of Attorney. However a Power of Attorney will be required at the next stage i.e. if a candidate submitting a PQQ as a consortium is invited to tender.
4.	PQQ/ Contract Notice	It is stated in the ITT that the Pre-qualification needs to be signed, can you confirm that in the case of a consortium the prime can sign on behalf of every company?	It is for the candidate to decide who should sign its PQQ. In principle and so long as it is legally empowered to do so, the prime may sign on behalf of every company. However please pay attention to Section 2 of the PQQ as follows: "The Contracting Authorities recognise that joint applications may be submitted. In the case that a joint application is proposed, each applicant must complete the parts relating to exclusion criteria, insurance and economic and financial capacity. There is a clear reminder of this at the start of the relevant section of the PQQ."
