Deputy Governor, Cyril Roux

Cyril Roux was appointed as Deputy Governor (Financial Regulation) of the Central Bank of Ireland in October 2013. He is responsible for the all regulatory activities in the Central Bank including prudential, conduct of business and markets supervision of financial services companies in Ireland. He is one of three executive members of the Commission (Board) of the Central Bank.

Mr Roux is a member of the Supervisory Board of the Single Supervisory Mechanism (SSM) and of the Governing Council of the European Systemic Risk Board. He is a member of both the Management Board and the Board of Supervisors of the European Securities and Markets Authority, as well as being a member of the Board of Supervisors of the European Banking Authority.

Prior to joining the Central Bank he was First Deputy Secretary General of the French resolution and supervisory authority (ACPR) where he oversaw the prudential supervision of half of the credit institutions, including specialized mortgage lenders and foreign banks, the prudential supervision of most of the insurance and reinsurance sector, international affairs, and accounting. Prior to joining the ACPR, Cyril Roux was the Deputy Secretary General of the French insurance supervisory authority (ACAM). He also spent 10 years at AXA Insurance in a variety of posts.

Cyril Roux holds a PhD in Economics from Harvard University. He is a graduate of Ecole Polytechnique (France) and a member of the French Institute of Actuaries. He earned a Bachelor's degree in Literature, *summa cum laude*, from the University of Paris - Sorbonne.

Cyril is a French citizen. He has been awarded the distinction of Chevalier de l'Ordre National du Mérite.
