

Curriculum Vitae Martine Wagner

Martine Wagner is Deputy Head of the CSSF's "Banking Supervisory Policy and SSM Coordination Department" which is in charge of coordinating prudential supervisory issues, including macroprudential aspects, in Luxembourg as well as assuming the CSSF's role as a member of the Single Supervisory Mechanism (SSM). In her capacity, Martine also interacts with the Luxembourg Ministry of Finance on banking regulatory issues and represents the CSSF in international fora, including the EBA, the European Commission and the Basel Committee, as well as the ECB's SSM horizontal functions.

Martine started her career as an auditor in renowned accounting firms and is licensed as a chartered accountant (*réviseur d'entreprises*) since 1992. In 1997, she joined the CSSF as a line supervisor of the banking supervisory department. Subsequently Martine moved to the "Accounting, Reporting and Auditing" division where she was exposed to a variety of topics in the areas of accounting, reporting and auditing. She participated in the implementation of IFRS and the setup of the Common Templates on Financial Reporting. Before assuming her current position, she facilitated the transposition of the Statutory Audit Directive and prepared the setup of the CSSF's statutory auditor public oversight department. Throughout her career, Martine has focused on regulatory aspects.

Martine holds a degree in Business Administration from the Institut Catholique des Hautes Etudes Commerciales (ICHEC), Brussels.
